

UTS PROGRAMS TAUGHT IN LOTE

The following resolutions are extracted from the confirmed minutes of Academic Board meeting 04/6 (1 December 2004):

- .1 that the report, *UTS Programs taught in LOTE*, be received;
- .2 that the pedagogy of earlier decisions to permit the delivery of any UTS research degree through the medium of a specific LOTE where supervision, library resources and examination can be provided in that LOTE be endorsed;
- .3 that the appropriateness of earlier decisions to permit the delivery of UTS coursework programs through the medium of a specific LOTE where all aspects related to the delivery of teaching and learning, as well as support for student participation can be provided in that LOTE, be endorsed;
- .4 that, from 1 December 2004, prior to course approval being recommended for any new coursework program offered through the medium of a specific language other than English, Academic Board must determine in principle whether the University can offer such programs in that language;
- .5 that, until the Board determines otherwise, no new UTS coursework programs taught through the medium of Chinese or any other LOTE be approved for delivery at UTS in Sydney;
- .6 that the Faculty of Business be asked to consider the future of the MBA (Mandarin International);
- .7 that the Board affirms that, as of 1 December 2004, the only language other than English approved in principle for the offering of UTS coursework programs is Modern Standard Chinese;
- .8 that the Teaching and Learning Committee of Academic Board be requested to develop clearer policy on arrangements for the delivery of Offshore Programs taught through Chinese, paying particular attention to the different modes of interaction with Chinese speaking partners and indicating where greater provision of delivery and quality assurance structures should come from UTS itself.
